What to consider when submitting student work:

- 1) Design projects should be completed within the last 5 years and be in line with the goals of DNEM.
- 2) Submission can be student work completed as a class assignment, thesis, or independent project.
- 3) There is no entry fee. DNEM does not endorse student work published on the website but it does promote work focused in DNEM's areas of interests.
- 4) Submissions must be in English.

Prepare your PDF submission using the template provided. Submissions are limited to the one-page PDF format. No additional material may be submitted.
